WHEREAS, *President Truman signed into law, PL 324, the observance of an annual National Day of Prayer. President Reagan permanently established the first Thursday of May to be the National Day of Prayer when he signed PL 100-307; and*

WHEREAS, *we are especially mindful of the heroic men and women serving in our Armed Forces, especially those service abroad; and*


WHEREAS, *the theme for this year is, "Prayer for such a Time as This."*
